

**WRIGHTSTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
MINUTES OF MEETING OF MARCH 26, 2007**

The Wrightstown Township Board of Supervisors Work Session was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by Chair Chester S. Pogonowski at the Township Building, 2203 Second Street Pike, Wrightstown. In attendance were Vice-Chair Jane B. Magne, Member/Treasurer Robert S. Lloyd, Township Administrator Eileen M. Bradley and Township Solicitor Terry W. Clemons.

**Foodshed Alliance:** Appearing on behalf of the Bucks County Foodshed Alliance were Mr. Jeffrey Scott, Esquire of Archer Griner; Ms. Kim Kaufmann and Mrs. Robin Hoy of the Bucks County Foodshed Alliance (FSA).

Mrs. Hoy presented points of a proposal to lease the Farmhouse and possible fields at the Anchor Run Farm for use by the FSA for educational classes and housing of farming interns. The FSA proposed to seek grants to make renovations to the building for a commercial kitchen and ADA compliant restrooms at an estimated cost of \$127,000.00.

The Township would be expected to forego rent on the property and make some maintenance repairs prior to the FSA taking over the building.

Mr. Clemons would draft a lease agreement and forward to Mr. Scott for consideration.

**Citadel Security:** The Board discussed a proposal for fire and burglar alarm installation and monitoring with Mr. Gene Zalewski of Citadel Security.

**Wrightstown Friends Trees:** Mr. Richard Segal and Mr. Richard King of The Wrightstown Friends Meeting discussed their proposal to remove additional diseased trees from the Friends Cemetery. The Meeting had been struggling with attempting to preserve the trees, but felt they were a safety liability and had to be removed. The trees would be replaced with a variety of disease-resistant species by fall. The Committee had agreed to remove three trees at this time, and monitor the condition of the remaining trees.

**Anchor Run Farm:** Ms. Bradley stated that a consultant, Serv Pro, had inspected the Ranchhouse at Anchor Run Farm and proposed several items that could address mold in the basement. She would follow up with the tenant and consultant.

**Proposed Ordinance:** The Board discussed a proposed construction inspection ordinance.

There being no further business or comment, Mr. Lloyd made a motion, seconded by Ms. Magne, to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m. All were in favor.
