

WRIGHTSTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WORK SESSION

February 09, 2026

The Wrightstown Township Board of Supervisors met on Monday, February 9, 2026, in the Meeting Room of the Wrightstown Township Municipal Building, 2203 Second Street Pike, Wrightstown, PA. Chair Chester S. Pogonowski called the meeting to order at 5:08 P.M. Present were Vice Chair Jane B. Magne, Treasurer Robert S. Lloyd, Solicitor Vicki Kushto, Township Engineer Cindy VanHise and Township Manager Stacy Crandell. All motions were approved by unanimous vote unless otherwise indicated.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

An executive session was held prior to the meeting to discuss litigation and open space.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

On a motion by Treasurer Lloyd, seconded by Vice Chair Magne, Board of Supervisors meeting minutes of February 2, 2026, with edits, were approved.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

There was none.

BUSINESS:

- A. Request for Relief for Pool Construction – 109 Joseph Drive.** The owner of the property Daniel Carey asked for approval to grade into deed-restricted open space for his pool project. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that the request would set a precedent for further requests to build in designated open space areas. His engineer noted that the project can be completed using a retaining wall. The Board did not grant the request.
- B. Matthew's Ridge Sewer Plant Filter Retrofit Options.** Rick Getts and Justin Nevamdomski from ARRO Engineering presented options and associated costs for retrofitting the filters at the Matthew's Ridge community wastewater treatment plant. There was a lengthy discussion of various membrane filters from Kubota and Toray. There was consensus that the Toray filters would be the most cost-effective option. A letter will be sent to residents of the Matthew's Ridge development to keep them informed of the progress. The discussion will continue at a meeting in March.
- C. Authorization for Purchase of a Snowblower by Public Works.** Roadmaster Dave James asked for approval to purchase a Toro heavy duty commercial snowblower. A machine is available through a Costars contract for \$3,079.20. On a motion by Chair Pogonowski, seconded by Vice Chair Magne, the purchase was approved.

ADJOURNMENT:

On a motion by Treasurer Lloyd, seconded by Vice Chair Magne, all voted to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 6:34 P.M.
